

Reset

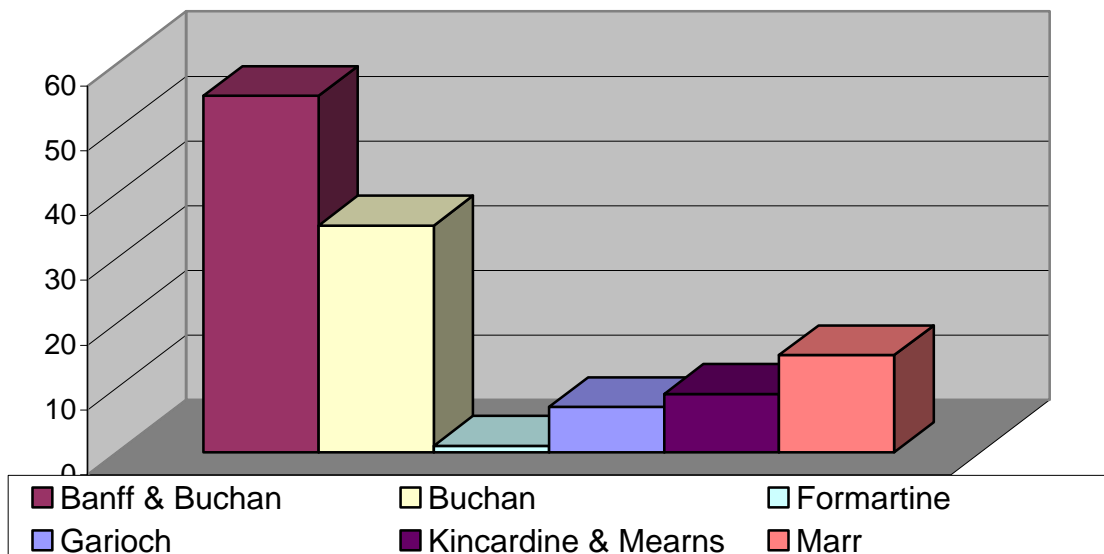
Reset is defined as “*a crime if any person, with intent, deprives the owner, to receive and keep property knowing that it has been appropriated by theft, robbery, embezzlement or fraud*”.

Reset accounted for **1%** of all reported crime in Aberdeenshire during the three-year period. Reported incidents of reset decreased by **31.0%** between 2001 and 2002, followed by an increase of **103.4%** between 2002 and 2003, which is the highest it has been in the last three-years. In total, there has been a **40.5%** increase in the numbers of reported incidents of reset in Aberdeenshire during the three-year period.

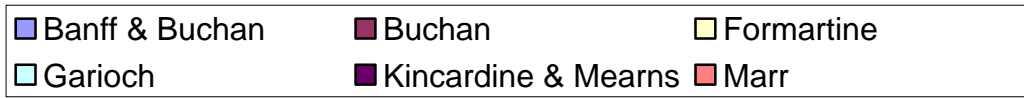
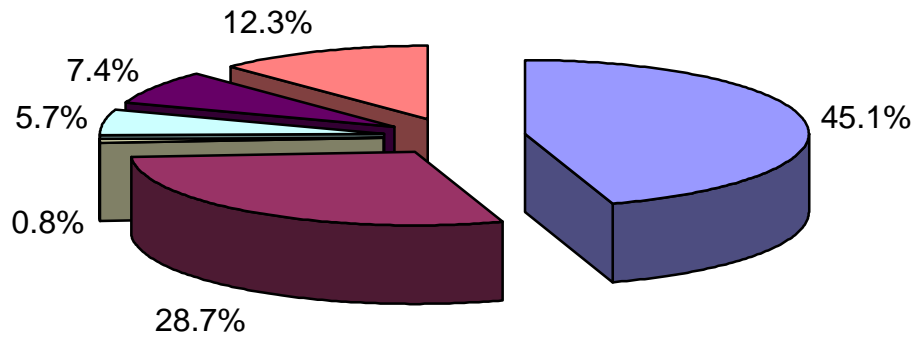
The areas in Aberdeenshire where the highest number of incidents of reset occurred were the Banff & Buchan area, which accounted for **45.1%** of all reported incidents of reset in Aberdeenshire respectively. The number of incidents occurring in the Buchan area (**28.7%**) was also significantly higher than the number of incidents in other areas within Aberdeenshire. The area with the lowest number of this type of crime was Formartine, which accounted for **0.8%** of all reported incidents of reset in Aberdeenshire.
